



Teach Every Child How

The TECH Campaign is a new effort being launched by the Kannapolis Education Foundation to prepare children for a lifetime of success. TECH stands for **Teach Every Child How**, and our goal is to put iPads into every classroom in Kannapolis City Schools.

Research shows that iPads make a powerful difference not only in the way children learn but also in how well they learn. According to studies, children with disabilities showed a 22% increase in their reading comprehension when they used iPads instead of traditional books. iPad apps also help speech impaired students find their voice and give visually impaired students the ability to increase print size and read with greater ease.

Research in regular education classrooms has found that math achievement skyrocketed 30% when students were able to use iPads as a learning tool. In addition, iPads bring learning

alive, and a single iPad can replace hundreds of text books.


Ultimately, when we prepare our children for success, we all benefit. Today's students will become our doctors, teachers,
